STANDING ORDERS (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE 1960

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Standing Orders Ordinance 1938 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance).

The Synod of the Diocese of Grafton in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Synod by the Constitutions for the management and good government of the Church of England within the State of New South Wales ordains directs and rules as follows:-

SHORT TITLE

1. This Ordinance may be cited and known as "Standing Orders (Amendment) Ordinance 1960."

AMENDMENT

2. Standing Order 19 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted:-

19. Notices of Question and Motion in writing may be given at the commencement of each day's sitting as provided in Standing Orders 16 and 17, after resumption from the luncheon and dinner adjournments of each day on call from the President.

3. Standing Order 21 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted:-

21. No question may be answered or motion debated during that part of the day's sitting during which notice of it was given. At the end of each Session votes of thanks and similar formal motions may be brought forward without notice.
