

cess of Synod the powers and functions in the said Ordinance referred to and in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Synod by the constitutions for the management and good government of the Church of England within the State of New South Wales or otherwise in the name and place of such Synod ordains declares and rules as follows—

1. By reason of changes subsequent to the creation of the said Trust it has become expedient to erect a Church building in the village of Lowanna instead of the village of Gundareen first chosen.
2. The trust fund known as the Gundareen Church Building Fund is hereby changed to the name of The Lowanna Church Building Fund.
3. The capital of the said Fund and accrued interest thereon shall be used in connection with the erection of a Church at Lowanna.
4. The said resolution of the Bishop-in-Council and all matters and things done by the Corporate Trustees in connection therewith are hereby validated and confirmed.

**THE GUNDAREEN CHURCH BUILDING FUND  
TRANSFER ORDINANCE, 1934**

**PREAMBLE.**

WHEREAS the parishioners of the Home Mission District of Lowanna did acting in accordance with the requirements of "The Regulation of Land Sales Ordinance 1919," petition the Bishop-in-Council to transfer the fund known and held in trust by the Corporate Trustees under the name of "The Gundareen Church Building Fund" to the name of "The Lowanna Church Building Fund", and to direct the Corporate Trustees accordingly. And whereas the Bishop-in-Council did by resolution grant such petition and did so direct the Corporate Trustees and it is necessary to validate and confirm the said resolution and any action taken thereunder Now therefore the Council of the Diocese of Grafton in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by "The Church of England Trust Property Act 1917," and the "Delegation of Powers Ordinance 1918," appointing the Council of the Diocese for the purpose of exercising during the
