WORSHIP: Do you Incorporate environmental prayers and readings into your regular worship			
Pray for local community bush/land care groups			
Conduct services during the Church year on creation spirituality			
Include lessons during Sunday school about caring for creation and hold regular Sunday School in the garden			
Involve young people in improving the environmental management of the church and grounds and involve them in developing creation spirituality.			
Lead any Liturgy outside in the open air (develop an outside chapel)			
Use environmentally-expressive hymns and songs during worship			
Hold a service with an environmental theme e.g. Harvest Festival, Rogation Sunday, Creation Sunday, World Environment Day, St Francis' Day			
Include environmental issues in study group Programs			
Use natural materials and images of nature within Worship			
Include symbols of creation on church banners			
Use resources from the "Season of Creation" website (www.seasonofcreation.com)			
FELLOWSHIP AND WELLBEING: Do you Enjoy the outdoors through a parish picnic, bushwalk or camp			
Reconnect with your parish's local environment - take a walk, learn about the natural features of your area			
Invite speakers to any of your church groups (MU, youth etc) to explore how developments in modern science are contributing to a deeper understanding of the mystery and wonder of God's Creation			
Participate in community bush/land care			
Encourage 'sabbath rest' i.e. deep spiritual rest, remembering God and putting all of life in perspective
