








Attendance at outcentres Weekly, Fortnightly, Monthly













Attendance at worship centres where there is only a service once a fortnight.

Average attendance at services held on a weekday.




Attendance at all services in the Diocese on Easter Eve & Easter Day.




Sum of Christmas Attendance Total

Total Christmas Attendance - 2020-2024



INSTRUCTIONS FOR <u>TABLE 3</u> BELOW (<u>please read before completing the Table below</u>). Please include:

- All attendees (not just communicants) at Sunday/Saturday worship including adults and children across all services and sites in your parish.
- Attendance at Saturday evening services as well as Sunday services
- All adults and children present, not just people who receive communion
- Clergy and other ministers attending or leading services
- Adults and children attending Sunday Schools or equivalent activities on Sunday
- Include attendance at Baptisms, including visitors. If the Baptism was held as a separate service, use the row entitled: "Baptism Service if held as a separate service". If the Baptism was held as part of the Sunday Eucharist, for example, include the attendees under that service
- Include any other church based activities on Sunday or Saturday evening at which worship is the primary purpose and predominant feature
- Include Easter Eve and Easter Day but not Maundy Thursday or Good Friday

Please do not include:

- · Christmas Day or Christmas Eve, even if they fall on a Sunday
- Do not include online participants in this table. Include them at Tables 4 and 5.


Attendance background

Conclusions

The collection of more detailed attendance figures is allowing us to better track trends in church attendance

We should be encouraged by a gradual increase in church attendance post-pandemic

2023 saw the highest attendance, indicating a return to or even surpassing prepandemic levels

2024 has seen a levelling out of Total Attendance and Average Sunday Attendance

Grafton attendance trends compare well with national attendance trends and do not support a narrative of declining attendance

Ministry Units have used missional opportunities (such as those offered by the restructure of worship centres) to try new things and to grow and have also shown resilience and adaptability in challenging times
